

OPERATION LIBERTY

Have your guests seen it, done it, been there, bought the T-shirt?

Then you need an event with a difference!

Operation Liberty could be just what you are looking for.....

Your guests arrive at a venue expecting to attend a conference or perhaps congregate for the final speeches at the end of a legitimate conference. Suddenly the doors burst open to the sound of gunfire and in rush heavily armed, masked Industrial Mercenaries. One of the senior executives or a new product is grabbed and dragged away at gunpoint.



Following a briefing on the situation (this is tailored to the company involved) the guests are split into patrols, kited out with camouflage clothing and undergo a series of "Training Tasks".

These tasks range from building rafts, to clearing a minefield, to weapons training and need only be as physical as your guest's abilities.

Fully trained personnel in the guise of "UN Advisers" supervise the tasks. The purpose of this training is to turn your guests into a "fighting unit" for the final exercise - the liberation of their kidnapped colleague or product.

The "Final Assault" is carried out with Paintball weapons against heavily armed enemy in a battle punctuated with the sound of thunder flashes and gunfire and shrouded in smoke. The hostage is of course rescued and returns safely from the ordeal.

Ideally an event would need six sections plus the final assault to occupy a full day.



Example Training Tasks

Minefield

The team are required to retrieve vital equipment from the minefield whilst blindfolded, with only their team members to talk them through. The minefield is cunningly designed with pyrotechnic trip wires and ground mines, when tripped there is a loud bang and your team member must return to the start line (a task where precise communication is essential).



Breacher's Buoy

Your team finds an armed nuclear bomb - the deactivation key is in the middle of a river on a post. You must recover the key by suspending a team member over the water using a 100 ft cable, pulleys, ropes and a climbing harness and disarm the bomb before it explodes (a real team effort).

Electric Fence

You discover an enemy installation protected by an electric fence and a mined ditch. Inside the compound is a valuable piece of electronic equipment, the team must recover it using two poles and some logs by building a complex cantilever device, but if anyone touches the fence it triggers a loud siren!



Raft Building

The team is marooned on an island - the only method of escape is the equipment supplied (barrels, planks and ropes) - beware of the missing barrel stoppers. Swimming is not an option!

MILITARY VEHICLES



FV432 Armoured Personnel Carrier

A 15 ton tracked vehicle that entered service with the British Army in 1963. Powered by a V8 Rolls Royce engine the 432 is capable of 35 m.p.h. and is still in limited service today.

Stalwart

The Stalwarts main function is as a support vehicle to Main Battle Tanks. Capable of 55 m.p.h. it can transport ammunition and fuel to the front line at high speed. Being six wheel-drive and four-wheel steer, the Stalwart can handle any terrain with ease.



SEARCH AND DESTROY

The search and destroy section is essential as it runs as a training exercise in the use of Paintball weapons.

After a full safety briefing and instruction of how to operate the weapons, their task is to embark on a close target recce. and locate and eliminate the lone terrorist.

Intelligence indicates that the terrorist is armed and extremely dangerous! However he is also heavily outnumbered and has very limited ammunition. Your choice of tactics will decide the outcome.

The team will leave the exercise with a perfect score if the terrorist is eliminated without any friendly casualties!
